Signage on all school gates and around the building to remind parents of social distancing measures. Social distancing marker tape in place outside the school gate. All messages and queries must be relayed through the school office by telephone or email. Leaving the school: Children will be dismissed from the playground to their parent/carer at the school gate. Exit doors are held open, reducing the number of occupants touching the doors. Children are reminded to wash hands as they leave the school building. Hand-wash stations are located at the exits from the school or classroom. Help is available for children and young people who have trouble cleaning their hands independently. Hand washing demonstrations have been provided to children on how to adequately wash their hands. Good hand washing signage to instruct children how to do this effectively is displayed.

Children will stay in their own group throughout the duration of their lunch and playtime. Only one student will use a clean lunch space before it is cleaned again. Tables are wiped clean with appropriate disinfectant before and after each group have their lunch. Children are advised to clean hands before and after eating lunch. Dining is organised so that no person sits facing another while eating. Social distancing marker tape has been used throughout the hall, as appropriate. MOVING AROUND THE SCHOOL. Movement to different areas within the schools is reduced as much as possible Suitable external doors are used to move children from one area to another. Where possible, all spaces are well ventilated using natural ventilation ie. open windows. Corridors are sterile environments and kept as clear as possible. We will operate a one-way system on the stairs. Safe distance signage is displayed around the school. Social distancing marker tape has been used, as appropriate. Times are allocated for each year group to reduce the need to pass one another in open spaces. PLAYGROUND Separate times or areas (at a safe distance using government guidance) are issued for each separate class group. Playground is 'zoned' for each group. Children are only permitted to complete suitable activities within their designated groups. Playground activities are strictly controlled with structured play. Social distancing marker tape has been used, as appropriate. Lunchtime play to be supervised by senior leaders, if required. USE OF TOILETS One in one out management of toilets is in place. Toilet use protocols are managed by teachers. Use of toilets while outside is managed by staff on duty and is communicated to children. Additional cleaning routines in place.
SCHOOL STAFF Spread/contraction of COVID-19 due to lack of social distancing measures. In particular school staff.	 All staff are required to conform with social distancing measures at all times. Staff shared areas are not to be used unless these are large enough to safely accommodate current staff numbers at safe distance from each other. Staff are encouraged to bring a packed lunch and to eat separately from each other, adhering to social distancing measures at all times. Children will be encouraged to practice social distancing measures from staff, appropriate to their age. PPE is available in accordance with government guidance.

VISITORS TO SCHOOL Spread/contraction of COVID-19 due to lack of social distancing measures for external visitors to the school, including: Parents Contractors Deliveries	 Parents/carers are not permitted to enter the school site, unless in an emergency. Parents/carers have been informed to call the school office or email if they have any questions or concerns. If parents/carers need to drop off items for children, they should be left at the school main entrance for staff to collect. However, this will be actively discouraged. The SLT will call parents if meetings are required. School office staff will keep the glass screen in the reception area closed at all times to reduce any risk of infection. Visitors will only be permitted into the school if they have an appointment. Visitors will only be permitted at their designated time and will be asked to wait outside of the school building until their school contact is available. The school contact is required to attend reception in good time to meet their visitor. Face to face meetings in small room or within 2 metres are not permitted. Premises' contractors will be managed in accordance with a separate premises maintenance risk assessment written specifically for this time Deliveries will be accepted at designated quiet times only and not during drop off and collection times.

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 Parents/carers receive guidance on school times for their child and protocols set out for attending the school i.e. should remaileast 1m apart from others, should follow staff members instruction and should not congregate outside the school. All documents have been uploaded to the school website. Parents of SEND children or those with care plans have been individually consulted in order that plans are reviewed to include new safety measures. Individual risk assessments for SEND children have been prepared, where appropriate. Staff have been briefed and consulted on school procedures and the plans for re-entry of children. Briefings will be in place for staff to share information as and when necessary. Staff have had sufficient training and briefing regarding infection control and school protocols. Hazard reporting mechanism are in place and easily accessible. Talks with staff about the planned changes (for example, safety measures, timetable changes and staggered arrival and depatimes), have taken place, including discussing whether additional training would be helpful. If a child is awaiting collection, they will be moved to a room where they can be isolated with appropriate adult supervision. Qualified first aiders are in place at an appropriate ratio for paediatric first aiders for Early Years provision. The school has a specific room dedicated for suspected cases of COVID-19. Occupants (staff or children) who display symptoms of the virus during the school day will be isolated in the designated room until additional medical assistance can be gained. This may be 111 support, an ambulance or until they leave the site to self-isolate. First aiders required to assist this person will wear full PPE including, apron, gloves and mask. The first aid room will be cleaned frequently and after each use (when first aid care has been provided) PPE should be used by staff for children who require intimate care. Staff kept up to date on COVID-19 testing facilities and engage with NHS Track and Trace. Waste disposal measures Waste control measure from possible cases of COVID-19 and cleaning of areas where possible cases have been identified (including disposable cloths and tissues) are as follows: Put in a plastic rubbish bag and tied when full. The plastic bag is placed in a second bin bag and tied. It is put in a suitable and secure place and marked for storage until the individual's test results are known. Waste is not put in communal waste areas until negative test results are known or the waste has been stored for at least 72 hours. If the individual tests negative, this can be put in with the normal waste. If the individual tests positive, then waste is stored for at least 72 hours and then put in with the normal waste. If storage for at least 72 hours is not appropriate, a collection by a specialist clinical waste contractor will be organised.

This includes the following: Additional cleaning/sanitising on a twice daily basis throughout the school. Frequent cleaning of all touched surfaces, such as door handles, handrails, table tops, play equipment and toys. Additional cleaning materials readily available in all areas. Classrooms furniture has been reduced, where possible, in order to improve the ability to effectively clean. Where appropriate, equipment used by the children will be sanitised overnight. If an area is suspected to have been contaminated by coronavirus (a positive case is detected for an occupant of a classroom), the room will be closed for 72 hours and then deep cleaned.

Suitable storage and management of flammable hand sanitizer is in place. All chemicals used for the cleaning of school buildings and equipment is COSHH assessed and managed appropriately. All cleaning chemicals are stored safely and securely in accordance with requirements; COSHH safety training has been completed by all those using chemicals for cleaning. Appropriate PPE is available for all cleaning including suitable PPE for cleaning of potential coronavirus contaminated rooms or equipment.
