Reading

We expect all children to read at home for a short time each night. Please make sure that you (or another adult) sign their reading diary every day.

At present, we will be sending reading books home every Monday and collecting these books on a Friday. The children's reading diaries will be checked on a Friday. This will allow time for books to be left for 72 hours before going home again.

For the children who are reading longer chapter books, they will return their book when finished. This book will then be left for 72 hours before going back on the book shelf. They can then choose a new book to take home.

Supporting at home

We ask that your child goes to bed at a reasonable time each night and that screen time is limited so that they are ready for their learning each day in school.

<u>P.E</u>

In Year 6 our PE days are **Mondays and Wednesdays**. On Mondays the children will have cricket during the autumn term. On Wednesdays they will have games with Coach. Please ensure that each item of your child's PE kit is in school on those days and is clearly labelled with their name.

Attendance and punctuality

It is really important that children are in school every day and on time. Being late does have a negative impact on their learning. We expect at least 96% attendance every year. However we do understand that, in these uncertain times, you must take extra precautions if your child is showing signs of Coronavirus. Please remember that if your child or any of your household is showing signs of Coronavirus that you must get tested and remain at home until you receive a negative test result or after 14 days from the first day of symptoms. Safeguarding and Online Safety

We take safeguarding very seriously. Our first priority is of course your child's welfare and school is required to take any reasonable action to ensure the safety of its pupils. Children are taught about keeping themselves safe as part of our curriculum. We have online safety lessons every term as part of their computing curriculum and this includes how to report concerns about content and contact online. To support your child you can:

- Be open and involved in discussions with your child about what they do online
- Use parental controls at home
- Supervise your child's use of certain programs and apps e.g. YouTube, TikTok



- Remember that the use of social media is not permitted the minimum age for apps such as Whatsapp is 13
- If you have a concern about online safety, please speak to a member of staff

School uniform

We are really proud of our school uniform and of how smart the children look. Please ensure your child is wearing the correct school uniform and make sure it is labelled clearly with your child's name. Communication

We use Parent Mail to communicate with parents using text and email; including our weekly newsletter. You can also check Class Dojo. We appreciate that at this present time it is very difficult to speak to your child's teacher. Please speak to a member of SLT on the school gate or phone the school office who will pass messages on. The class teacher will phone you back after school if you need to speak to them but please bear in mind that the teacher may have meetings after school and may not be able to call you back on the same day.

We will be holding an early Parent-Teacher meeting in the week beginning 21st September. This will be a ten minute phone call to give you an opportunity to have a 1:1 meeting with the class teacher. Please look out for more information on Parent Mail.
