School Attendance

Parents are reminded of the following:

- ♦ If your child fails to attend school on the last day of term, or the first day of the new term, you could be liable to a Penalty Notice charge of £60.00.
- ♦ You are committing an offence if your child doesn't attend school regularly, and it is not agreed by the school (unauthorised absence). In some cases, unauthorised absence may result in prosecution.
- ♦ Fines are issued by the council on behalf of schools and are: £60 per parent, per child, if payment is made within 21 days or £120 per parent, per child, if paid after 21 days but within 28 days.
- ♦ When the school agrees for your child to miss school in advance, or accepts your explanation, absence is 'authorised'. All other absence is 'unauthorised'.
- ♦ Penalty Notices may be used where absence is unauthorised, for example, when:

1. a parent has taken their child on holiday during term without authorisation
2. enquiries made at school after a truancy sweep show the pupil's absence at that time as unauthorised
3. pupils are regularly late for school after the register has closed
4. a pupil has eight or more unauthorised absences within the previous 10-week period.
