

Black History Month 2023—Celebrating our Sisters

Olive Elaine Morris was a community activist, who fought for Black women's rights and against racism, sexism and other forms of inequality.



Morris was brought up by her maternal grandmother in Jamaica. In 1962 she and her brother left the Caribbean to join her parents in England.

In November 1969 Olive intervened in an altercation between the police and a Nigerian diplomat. The diplomat had parked his Mercedes on Atlantic Road in Brixton, leaving his wife and children in the car while he bought some records. Police officers, thinking the diplomat had stolen the car, began to arrest and beat him. Olive, who was only five foot two inches, physically tried to stop the police from attacking the diplomat, however, the police turned on her, arresting and assaulting her.

In 1974, Morris co-founded the Brixton Black Women's Group and the Organisation of Women of Asian and African Descent (OWAAD). She was also a member of the 'Manchester Black Women's Cooperative', 'Black Women's Mutual Aid Group', and the 'Brixton Youth Section' of the 'Black British Panther Party'. She also campaigned for better educational provision for Black children.



NDOCHINA Olive organised protests, set up support groups, travelled extensively and wrote.

Sadly in 1979, having achieved much in her short life, Olive died of cancer, aged only 27.

In 1986, to honour her activism, Lambeth Council named the Council offices on Brixton Hill and a children's playground in Myatt's Fields, after her.
