Wednesday 8th November 2023, King Charles III attended an event organised by the Korean British Cultural Exchange in collaboration with Kingston Museum and was observed for the first time in history, wearing not one but two Remembrance pins.

The second being a BlackPoppyRose to honour the memory of ALL lives of several communities during World War I & II and beyond.

BlackPoppyRose was established in 2010 by Cultural & Ancestral Genealogist & Global War Heritage Specialist Selena Carty to honour the memories of the African, Black, West Indian, Caribbean, Pacific Islands & Indigenous Nations contributions to Wars/Rebellions/Revolutions since the sixteenth-century.




