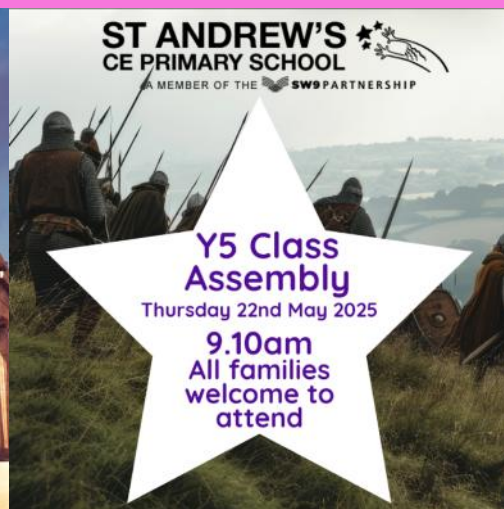

Six **FREE** events to do at the National History Museum

1. Stomp like a dinosaur

Do your best T.rex impression as you explore the different time periods in which dinosaurs lived, sort the facts from the myths about why they died out and what scientific research has taught us about these prehistoric giants.

2. Take a photo with Andy's Clocks

You're in for the biggest welcome in London. Look up at the skeleton of the blue whale – the largest animal on Earth. This female blue whale is named Hope, as a symbol of humanity's power to shape a sustainable future.

5. Say hi to a Stegosaurus

Meet this incredible dinosaur specimen, the most intact Stegosaurus fossil skeleton ever found. It's three metres tall and almost six metres long, giving you a dramatic welcome to Earth Hall.

6. Get curious in our new gardens

Scan the pond for dragonflies; follow in the footsteps of our earliest Human ancestors and learn what the future of our planet might look like, all in our new Gardens.
